Box 582, Clemson, SC 29633. An abstract, 3-10 key words, and a running head must be included with each manuscript. All measurements should be given in metric or in metric and English units. A charge of \$40.00 per page will be made. This is an average figure which includes photographs, simple tables and figures, partial pages, etc. (Complicated or excessive tables, photographs and figures might be subject to a \$5.00 - 20.00/page surcharge. Page charges are subject to change without notice.)
